Letter FROM the Editor By Jim Szabo

The Northeast Ohio area had just been pummeled by many inches of snow. Emails from our NEODBUG agenda committee reassured the Board that our speaker was in town and ready to conduct our class. The snow in my apartment's driveway had not been plowed for many hours, so it was a slow, sliding trip to the street, wheels spinning along the way. I-480 East was in pretty good shape until the I-77 interchange, where a spun-out vehicle on the exit ramp stopped traffic for forty minutes. A slippery trek up Quarry Lane and a snowy parking lot were the last obstacles, finally getting to the DoubleTree Inn at about 9:15.

My story of the trials and tribulations getting to the February 14 NEODBUG educational meeting pales in comparison with many that we heard that day. Some attendees could not get their driveways plowed for hours, showing up for the class as late as 11:30.

But they came - forty-eight hardy attendees made it to Bonnie Baker's "DB2 V8 for Developers and DBAs".

Paul's second presentation is titled "DB2 v9 .Net Add-ins". DB2 V9 for Linux, Windows and Unix has recently become generally available and provides many enhancements for autonomic computing, storage management, business intelligence and native XML support. In addition to the many enhancements for database operation, DB2 V9 provides support for Microsoft® Visual Studio 2005. The IBM® Database Add-in for Visual Studio 2005 provides significant enhancements to application development using DB2 databases, tight integration with Microsoft Server Explorer and enhanced debugging. It introduces IBM designer to creating database objects and includes several other enhancements. This presentation will provide an overview and demonstration of the new features in IBM Database Add-ins for Visual Studio 2005, and will illuminate the differences in this latest version when compared to IBM DB2 Development Add-ins developed for Visual Studio .NET 2003.

Paul Wirth is a Senior Data Management Technical Sales Specialist with IBM Corporation, located in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Paul has been involved in database administration and storage management for the past twenty years. Over the years, Paul has worked in database administration with IMS, DB2 and Oracle. Paul has also worked extensively with enterprise storage subsystems for both Open Systems and z/OS.

For the afternoon, we begin with Ulf Mattson of Protegrity Corporation. Ulf created the initial architecture of Protegrity's database security technology, for which the company owns several key patents. His exten-

sive IT and security industry experience includes twenty years with IBM as a manager of software development and a consulting resource to IBM's research and development organization, in the areas of IT architecture and IT security. Ulf holds a degree in electrical engineering from Polhem University, a degree in finance from University of Stockholm and a master's degree in physics from Chalmers University of Technology.

Ulf will be presenting for us **"Database Encryption - How to Balance Security and Performance"**. Encryption can provide strong security for data at rest, but developing a database encryption strategy must take many factors into consideration. Organizations must balance between the requirement for security and the desire for excellent performance. Packaged database encryption solutions have proven to be the best alternative to protect sensitive data.

This is a specialized and complex solution area and if internal resources don't have the cryptography expertise in relation to your IT environment, outside expertise should be used to ensure superior performance. This session reviews the performance aspects of three dominant topologies for database encryption. This session will review how to balance performance and database security utilizing different IBM encryption solutions, including native DB2 solutions, ICSF, CCF, CPACF, DB2 EDITPROC, DB2 FIELDPROC and DB2 user-defined functions (UDFs).

We finish the afternoon with a presentation by David Sukert from Mainline Information Systems, talking about **"SOA"**. David has twenty-six years of industry experience in designing and developing business applications. He specializes in various forms of persistence technologies, open source frameworks, SOA and enterprise application integration. At Mainline Information Systems, he provides technical leadership towards SOA initiatives and is responsible for Websphere customer implementations and support. David is an IBM Certified Enterprise Developer and has a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Computer Engineering from California Polytechnic University.

normal three-hour trip took her seven hours, the worst of it being when she reached northeast Ohio. And to top it off, the heater in her vehicle didn't work!

Some will ask why NEODBUG even held the class when the weather was so bad. Well, here are a few of the reasons:

- We had a contractual agreement with the hotel that would have required us to pay for the meeting even if it didn't happen - thousands of dollars. NEODBUG cannot afford to take that kind of loss.
