### 2008 - The Year in Review

For the afternoon, we began with a presentation from Bob Coppedge, President of Simplex-IT LLC. Bob presented *"Microsoft SQL Server 2008"*.

We finished the afternoon session with a member-company talk from Progressive Insurance entitled: *"24/7 Environment, Need to Update Production Data? Audit, Data Security & SOX Compliance Fears!!! Don't Worry, Be Happy!!!"*. The presenters were Glenn Bielick, Ashish Malhotra and Lori Zarembo.

In August, we started the first half of the day with IBM's Paul Wirth. His presentation was titled *"Using DB2 Connect to Make Connections to DB2 z/OS"*.

Our second presentation for the day was given by IBM's Glen Sheffield: *"DB2 9.5 for Linux, UNIX, and Windows - What's New and How to Migrate"*.

After lunch, we had two presentations from IBM's Willie Favaro: *"Structure and Format Enhancements in DB2 for z/OS V9: Universal Table Space & Reordered Row Format"* and *"Should Your Next*
