XML continues to be an emerging technology and more features are being added to DB2 to support it. So what’s new with this XML data type?

Follow the adventures of ‘Dr. Node’, an XML document as he gets inserted into a DB2 table. Not only will you see how he is related to his parent row, but you will learn about his hierarchical tree structure and the catalog tables involved in supporting him. We will then put the parsed XML document under a microscope, and examine the actual data that is stored. You will also see how to use the new DB2 V10 XMLMODIFY commands to manipulate individual nodes within Dr. Node, and the effects of those commands. We will end with a discussion on XML indexes and demonstrate how to create indexes with the new DB2 10 DATE and TIMESTAMP data types.

Donna will follow up the XML discussion with a presentation called [To Include or Not Include? That is the Question](#).

DB2 V10 introduced the ability to include non-key columns in a unique index, allowing index only access without affecting the unique key. That’s great for the transaction benefiting from index only access, but what about the other transactions that access this index? Can they be negatively affected?

This talk will provide an overview of index include columns, look at storage requirements for the index include column, determine what queries will benefit from this feature, determine what queries may be negatively impacted by this feature and review EXPLAIN output and performance statistics to help you answer the question, “To include or not to include?”.

Donna Di Carlo has been in the software business for over thirty years. Her early days were devoted to performance tuning and capacity planning for the automotive industry. The last twenty years have been with BMC Software as a lead software developer specializing in DB2 backup & recovery. Donna last spoke to NEODBUG in August, 2012.
