Our featured speaker will be **Mark Rader of IBM**, who will give two presentations: in **"DB2 for z/OS: Data Sharing Technical Deep Dive"**, he will look at how DB2 Data Sharing relies on Coupling Facility structures, especially the Lock Structure and Group Buffer Pools. Come learn what they do and how to monitor their behavior. This session also addresses how your infrastructure changes as your workload grows, and what options are available to facilitate these changes.



In **"DB2 10 and 11 Optimizer Update"**, he will provide the latest information on how the DB2 for z/OS Optimizer has evolved to improve plan management, predicate indexability, use of in-memory cache and other features.

Mark is a Senior Consulting IT Specialist with IBM ATS. He has over 30 years of technical experience with IBM, primarily with DB2 for z/OS, focusing on data sharing, performance, and DB2 and Workload Manager (WLM) interaction. He has led many DB2 data sharing implementations and has presented a variety of topics at IOD and regional user group meetings. He is an author of redbooks on Parallel Sysplex application considerations, DB2 data sharing, and DB2 for z/OS distributed function.

We will also have **Mike Wingfield of Compuware** join us to talk about **"Mainframe DB2 for z/OS Performance & Tuning"**.



Mainframe application performance management has become even more imperative today with processor speeds approaching the theoretical limit of 7 Ghz. So just throwing hardware at performance problems is not enough anymore. Application response times and run-times need to be tuned to run as efficiently as possible and often times when DB2 is a big player in the application, that is where most of

the performance opportunities will be found. We will look at several DB2 tuning opportunities in CICS, batch, and DDF; analyzing the SQL text, the DB2 access paths, and the DB2 catalog objects involved.

Mike has been in IT for over 35 years and has been working with DB2 since Version 1.1 in 1987 as a programmer, DBA, Tech Support, Data Modeler, Data Architect, and for the last 20 years as a DB2 Performance and Tuning Specialist. Mike has been utilizing Strobe since 1991 and has documented mainframe operating cost savings of over 50 million dollars using Strobe from 1994 through 2001. As a Strobe Solution Consultant for the last 10 years in Compuware's Field Technical Support, Mike takes part in Application Performance Assessments for many Strobe customers throughout North & South America, Asia/Pacific, and Europe analyzing Batch, Onlines, Stored Procedures, and DDF performance with Strobe and iStrobe and providing recommendations for runtime and response time improvements.

Our November program will also include a member company talk by **Bob Vargo and Mike Tobe from Progressive**, who will summarize their recent **"DB2 Data Sharing Member Consolidation"**.



Bob is a Senior Systems Programmer, member of the Board of the International DB2 Users Group (IDUG) and past chair of the IDUG DB2 Tech Conference. He last spoke to NEODBUG in August of 2006, though you have seen him at more recent meetings giving updates on IDUG activities. He joined the NEODBUG Board of Trustees in 2010 and is a member of our agenda committee.

Mike is a Systems Engineer with Progressive, with over 23 years experience in enterprise database management.
