That meeting will be on **Thursday, May 21** at the Crowne Plaza Hotel and Conference Center in Independence, Ohio.

We are pleased to welcome two speakers for the day: **Jim Dee of BMC** and **Charles Lewis of IBM**.

Jim is speaking to NEODBUG for the first time. His two morning presentations are **Stop Wasting Time with Utilities!** and **EXPLAIN Yourself and Improve DB2 Performance!**

What is the ideal frequency of execution for most utilities? Jim will start by discussing the answer to that question and then move on to how to implement a strategy to achieve it. The focus will be on RE-ORG, COPY, and RUNSTATS, but we will glance at UNLOAD and LOAD also. Hint: the answer is automation.

Are you getting the most out of EXPLAIN, and are you doing everything you can to help the DB2 optimizer do its job? This presentation helps you answer these questions. IBM has made many enhancements to the EXPLAIN command and parts of DB2 around it, in DB2 10 and 11. Jim's second presentation goes into some of these changes and how you can take advantage of them to help the DB2 optimizer and get the best performance out of your DB2 applications.

Jim Dee is a Corporate Architect in the Data Management organization in R&D at BMC Software. He is responsible for the technical content and integration of the DB2 for z/OS product lines. He has worked at BMC since 1990, mostly in DB2 Backup and Recovery, as a developer, product author, and architect, and has held his current position as Chief Architect since 2007. Prior to joining BMC Software, Jim worked at various employers in the IT industry for 16 years. He worked as an application developer, systems programmer, DBA, and vendor developer. Jim has a B.A in Mathematics with a minor in Computer Science from Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario.

In his first presentation, Charles will discuss the things to look for in DB2 11 migration planning.

The value of an organization’s data assets relate to the value of the applications that access the data. Data powers applications, and applications power organizational performance. In Charles’ second presentation, you learn about recent DB2 for z/OS features that enable efficient and agile development of new applications. Topics to be covered include new analytics capabilities, temporal data enhancements, new SQL Procedure Language features, advances in large object management, enhanced XML support and integration with Hadoop-managed data.

Charles Lewis is a Sr. Certified DB2 Advisor for System z with IBM's Mid-Atlantic technical sales team. He has broad experience as an application developer and database consultant with more than 36 years of IBM experience. He has worked extensively in DB2 application design, capacity planning and performance tuning. In his current assignment he consults with and supports IBM clients implementing currently supported versions of DB2 for z/OS.
