Robert will be our morning speaker, presenting first **“The Most Important Stuff You Should Know About Db2 12 for z/OS, in 75 Minutes”**.

Db2 12 for z/OS is packed with new features and functions, and the scope of that new functionality expands several times per year with the delivery of successive function levels - Db2 12 continuous delivery in action. It's easy to talk all day about Db2 12, and I do that on a regular basis. For this session, I've boiled down what I personally consider to be the most important Db2 12-related information into a 75-minute presentation. Z hardware and z/OS exploitation, performance enhancements, package bind possibilities, utility goodies, SQL capabilities, smarter data sharing, and more. This is my take on the best of the best of the Db2 12 story.

Presentation #2 from Robert will be **“Data-as-a-Service: the REST Interface for Db2 for z/OS”**.

Non-DBMS-specific SQL interfaces such as JDBC and ODBC have been helpful for developers, enabling them to write code that accesses relational database management systems without having to customize that code for a specific relational DBMS; nowadays, however, a growing number of developers want a data-access interface that provides a still-higher level of abstraction with regard to the particulars of a specific data-serving platform. REST – Representational State Transfer – is an architectural style that enables the use of such an interface, and Db2 for z/OS has a built-in REST interface. In this session, attendees will learn of how Db2 for z/OS REST services are created, how Db2 processes REST calls, how IBM z/OS Connect fits in the picture, and how one might determine whether the SQL path or the REST path to Db2 would be the best fit for a given application.

Robert Catterall is an IBM Senior Consulting DB2 for z/OS specialist. He started

his IT career with IBM in 1982, and worked throughout the 1990s as a member of the Company's DB2 for z/OS National Technical Support team. From 2000 to 2007, Robert worked as a database technology strategist for CheckFree (now part of Fiserv). After working for three years as an independent DB2 consultant, he rejoined IBM in 2010. Robert is a past President of the International DB2 Users Group (IDUG), and a member of IDUG's Speakers Hall of Fame. Interpreting EXPLAIN data becomes more difficult as the complexity of SQL has grown. Fortunately there are no-charge tools available to make the most of all the EXPLAIN data that is currently available. In this presentation, we will discuss:

- A brief overview of Data Studio
- Invoking the Quick Explain
- Invoking the Query Tuner
- Reading the Access Path reports
- Examples

Our final presentation of the day will be David's *“SQL Update for Db2 11 and 12”*.

In this presentation, we'll discuss some SQL features from the last few Db2 releases that you may have missed. These features will make life easier for most SQL developers.

- Advanced GROUPing
- Piecewise DELETE
- SQL Pagination
- Enhanced MERGE statement



David Simpson is currently the Vice President of Themis Inc. He teaches courses on SQL, Application Programming, Database Administration as well as optimization, performance and tuning. He also installs and maintains the database systems used for training at Themis and works with our network of instructors to deliver high quality training solutions to our customers worldwide. David last spoke to NEODBUG at its April, 2017 education event.
